Foster Care, Adoption and Family Services

Wayfinder provides a safe haven, reduces trauma and finds stable placements in loving homes for abused and neglected children. They achieve better long-term outcomes in health, education and employment.

9,623 children who had been recently removed from their homes have found safety and loving care at **The Cottage**, our temporary shelter program, since 2016.

17,849 children have found stability and permanency in loving homes through our **adoption programs** since 1980.

9,460 kinship family members have received emergency assistance, case management and support services in our **Kinship Support Services Program** for extended family raising children who otherwise would go into foster care.

Vision Loss and Multiple Disabilities

From infancy through adulthood, Wayfinder provides children and adults who are visually impaired or multi-disabled with programs that increase health, well-being, economic opportunity and educational success.

20,987 babies and toddlers with visual or other disabilities and **62,961 family members** have received home visits and supportive services that improved developmental outcomes in our statewide **Child Development Services** since 1983.

50,064 children with visual or multiple disabilities and family members have enjoyed **adapted sports, recreation and outdoor adventures at Camp Bloomfield** since 1958.

2,744 teenagers and adults with vision loss learned skills for independent living, employment and success in higher education in Wayfinder's **transition services, residential rehabilitation and workforce development programs** over the last 10 years.

Medical and Mental Health Services

Wayfinder provides essential medical services 24 hours per day, seven days per week to children and young adults in programs on our Los Angeles campus, as well as emotional and behavioral counseling services to children, adults and families that build resiliency.

130,289 hours of mental health therapy have been provided to clients dealing with vision loss, multiple disabilities, behavioral issues or trauma since 2012.

89% of clients in mental health services decreased the impairments that were preventing them from functioning well in their schools, families, relationships or social interactions.

Wayfinder's nursing staff administered **548,960 doses of medication** over the last six years to clients in our residential programs and Special Education School.
